## PERFORMANCE NOTES:

- The 32 nd notes in the right hand of the piano beginning in measure 21 can be played more like grace notes rather than full-value 32nd notes.
- In measure 53, the word "aged" should be pronounced with two syllables.
- In measure 55, treat the word "fires" as a one syllable word.
